Evaluating Beekeeping Activity and Challenges in Algeria: A Contribution to the MEDIBEES Project

Abstract:

The honey bee plays a very important role in plant biodiversity and the natural and environmental balance. It is considered a biological marker that alerts us to the state of the natural environment. In Algeria, *Varroa* is a major problem in beekeeping, as it is a very serious condition due to the development and handling of the ectoparasitic *Varroa* mite. Within the framework of the MEDIBEES project - Monitoring of Mediterranean bee subspecies and their resilience to climate change for the sustainable improvement of agroecosystems - a survey was conducted in 2021, with the objective of characterizing and understanding the beekeeping activity and its main problems in Algeria, compared to other countries of the Mediterranean basin. This survey was conducted simultaneously in Spain, Italy, Malta, Turkey, Portugal, Lebanon, and Jordan, partner countries of the MEDIBEES consortium. The survey was disseminated in Algeria by e-mail and sent to all beekeeping associations and beekeepers. Visits of the beekeepers were also carried out to have the maximum of answers. In this article, only the results obtained for Algeria will be presented. In total, 200 questionnaires were analyzed. The respondents have apiaries in 19 ways of the country. The results of this study show the constraints on the development of beekeeping in Algeria in recent years, the drought, the very high mortality, and the presence of pathologies. COVID has had a negative influence on the yield of beekeepers. A very low yield of honey is obtained during these last two years. Among the positive points of the survey is the presence of beekeepers who practice good beekeeping (renewal of queens every year, selection at the level of the apiaries, the practice of transhumance) and the periodic screening of the varroasis in the honey bee colonies. The beekeeping associations must be on the field for the organization of the beekeeping sector and the improvement of the current situation.
